





Nation's Conscience

What is Corruption Risk Management?

Corruption Risk Management (CRM) is a simple in-house management tool to assess corruption risks in an organization, analyze its causes and develop corrective measures to minimize or eliminate those risks proactively.



Why CRM?


All public and private agencies are exposed to corruption risk. Conduct of CRM can avoid a number of complications such as:
